PUTTING HOOSIER STUDENTS FIRST

As a father of five and husband to a schoolteacher, Curtis understands that Hoosier parents are concerned about the quality of education their children receive. CUTTING BUREAUCRATIC RED TAPE

Indianapolis should not be meddling in Hoosier classrooms.
